BEECHCRAFT PLAINSMAN

The Beechcraft Plainsman was a car that was in some ways the car of the future. The Beechcraft Plainsman Concept Car was a car made in 1946 by the Beech Aircraft Company in Wichita, Kansas. The Plainsman was fitted with an air cooled four cylinder Franklin engine driving a generator, which in turn powered four electric motors, one for each wheel. It was fitted with fully independent air suspension. It also had an aluminum body. It weighed 2,200 pounds (1,000 kg), its top speed was 160 miles per hour (260 km/h), and could carry six passengers. Generous windows and curved doors blended into the roof of this fastback design. Crash protection was built into the design. Only two were built.



SAMSON SWITCHBLADE FLYING CAR

Several years ago a guy from Los Cruses New Mexico, Jerry Clark, talked at a Chapter meeting about the Samson Switchblade flying car he had ordered. After the meeting he said that he probably wouldn't live to see his flying car because he was in his eighties but he had invested several million dollars in what he hoped would be the future of flying. He did make it into his nineties but never got his flying car. Each year at Oshkosh I check out the Samson booth to see how they are doing..

The plane/car flew in 2022 but hey are still fine tuning it get it ready for production.. These are the latest developments.

The tail retraction is simpler than before, and the changes will increase the speed of assembly and reduce maintenance.

Along with the improvements in aerodynamics and performance, the interiors are also being upgraded to allow the original design more room from side-to-side. More room for people, elbows, coffee cups - the usual! The front trunk or 'frunk' is still large enough for roller bags or traveling golf club sets. Storage behind the seats has been limited a bit, but space is still there for personal items.

The side windows have been increased in size to provide better visibility and greater safety. We are engaging automotive designers to complete the interior and exterior design prior to making molds, while working on wings and tail that are already fixed in design and not subject to change.

The Eyes Forward Display (functions as a digital dash for Ground Mode, and

changes to include critical aviation information for Flight Mode) is being revised slightly to present a fresh but familiar round dial instrument cluster that is easy to read at a glance for most people. We found that as nice as the futuristic tape displays are to look at, the function in normal use requires a display that can be easily read and understood at a glance. We still plan on including driver adjustable color schemes both to match interior choices, and also to accommodate people with color blindness. More on this to come!

Many people over the years have told us that they will get their pilot certificate in order to have and use a Switchblade. Our marketing surveys of Regional Travelers (those who take trips of 200-500 miles) showed that 80% of the people who were willing to pay the price of a Switchblade (and would spend a week at the factory to get that price) were also willing to get a pilot certificate in order to use the Switchblade to improve their lifestyle. This seems to be backed up by the student pilot increase statistics, and so we find it credible.

Samson has embarked on the path to provide Switchblade flight training, and private pilot training, in a program specific for the Switchblade. We encourage people to get their Switchblade and use it for pilot training, as it will reduce the cost of pilot training in half. You also learn in the vehicle that you intend to fly, which is really ideal. Much more efficient and comfortable than learning on one or more planes and then doing a transition to the Switchblade afterwards. We feel that the Switchblade will be easier to learn with and has additional safety features built in, not found on typical training aircraft, that make flight safer for new pilots.
